CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – READ CAREFULLY NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS ALL DOGS RUN AT OWNERS SOLE RISK.

Open to all AKC registered dog breeds, dogs with ILP/PAL registration numbers, and All-American dogs listed in the Canine Partners Program. All entries must be one year of age or older on the day of the test. Each dog requires an individual entry form. Entries will not be accepted without fees, signatures, and the "Agreement" found on the Official AKC Entry Form. Bitches in season and lame dogs will be refused entry and, if presented at inspection, will be refunded entry fees. AKC registered dogs with breed disqualifications may be entered. Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. Continuous loop lure machines will be used. The lure will consist of white plastic bags. Backup equipment will be available.

REFUNDS: This is an AKC Event. Refunds will not be issued if a dog is pulled, or entries are canceled after the closing date or during the event. Refunds will only be issued for lame or in season dogs. No entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot be started or completed because of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the club.

INSPECTIONS: AKC rules require an inspection prior to each run. There will be rolling inspections as exhibitors arrive. The inspectors will be near the check-in table so make it a point to head there first when you're ready to run. We must make sure the dog is not injured or in heat. All canines will need to be inspected and checked off on the list. Including all Day of Entries and Fun Runs participants. The Inspection Committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test, and in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded.

Roll call will follow inspections. Test will follow roll call.

Check the run order and be standing by when your run is near. Make sure you have a releaser and a catcher arranged for your dog(s). Have a collar and leash available for both the catcher and releaser. Try to catch the dog as quickly as possible and leave the catch-area so the next run may commence and please listen to the Paddock master and Huntmaster.

Please, No treats, toys or mechanical whistles can be used in the shoot at any time.

COLLARS & LEASHES: Since this is an AKC event, all rules governing the trials are in effect. No dogs are permitted to have prong collars, choke collars, or electronic collars on the track or on the grounds where the trial is being held. We ask that you follow these rules and make sure your dog is not wearing one of these three types of collars. No tags or other objects can be attached to the collar unless they are taped up out of the way. No flexi-leads are allowed to be used anywhere near the run area.

Any dog exhibiting aggression towards any person will be asked to leave immediately and a refund will not be issued. Any dog that cannot be examined by the inspection committee will be excused and a refund will not be issued. In this event, an aggressive dog form may be filled out and submitted to AKC. Loose Dogs on the Field: There will be a **\$20** fee assessed to any loose dog on the field that is not competing. Please keep a hold of your dogs or put them up somewhere safe. There is a lot of excitement with other dogs barking and the bunny running. As a courtesy to other entrants, a testing dog should have a reliable recall.

TIMES AND POINTS: The dogs run, singularly, a 100-yard straight dash. The time to complete this run is converted into miles per hour (mph). Points are earned based on the handicapped speed and titles are awarded when the dog has accumulated a given number of points. A standard formula is used to convert time and handicap into mph. 204.545. Dog's time = MPH MPH x HANDICAP = POINTS Your dog's handicap is based on their height at their withers:

```
**18" or greater = handicap 1.0
```

**12" up to 17.9" = handicap 1.5

**Under 12" = handicap 2.0

Titles are earned by accumulating points.

BCAT = 150 pts

DCAT = 500 pts

FCAT = 1000 pts FCAT# = every additional 500 points

Light blue participation ribbons will be awarded to all dogs passing their tests. New title ribbons are available as your dog earns new titles, find the trial secretary table to collect your ribbons!
